





SCPA SPELLING BEE Feb. 9 (MS) and Feb 10 (HS)


- If you would like to participate in the SCPA Spelling Bee, please sign up below and include your grade level in the comment section. Be sure to read all of the information before signing up. By signing up, you agree to all the information below.
- 1. You cannot be on Academic or Behavior Probation.
- 2. The middle school Bee will be hosted Feb 9 at 10:15 AM. The high school Bee will be hosted Feb 10 at 10:15 AM. The Bees will be in the school theatre. Once eliminated, students may stay in the audience until dismissed by Mrs. Butler. The only students who will be in the theatre at this time are the participants and Mrs. Butler's 6th period class.
- 3. A list of words for both Middle and High School students will be provided shortly.
- 4. Students must have a LEE form signed by all teachers and a parent to miss class for the Bee. This will be delivered to you in class and is due to Mrs. Butler in room 222 no later than Feb. 7 by 3:45 PM. This form verifies that you have at least a C in all of your classes at this time.
- 5. Students who place top 2 for middle school and top 3 for high school MUST attend the Somerset Academy Inc. Spelling Bee on March 11, 2023, at Somerset Academy Bay (9600 SW 97 Ave. Miami, FL 33176) to compete against other winners from other Somerset schools. For this Bee, middle school starts at 11:00 AM (arrive by 10:30 AM) and high school starts at 1:00 PM (arrive by 12:30 PM).
- 6. Transportation to the Somerset Academy Bee in Miami is NOT provided, so parents must provide their own transportation to and from the Bee for their student.
- 7. Winners (top 2 for middle school and top 3 for high school) will earn: a certificate, house points, volunteer hours, and other prizes TBD.
- 8. Winners for the Somerset Academy Inc. Spelling Bee have been awarded cash prizes in the past. Awards for this year have not been announced yet.



Create a Greeting Card Scholarship

- Scholarship is open to all high school, college, and university students. The only eligibility criteria is that students must be at least 14 years or older at the time of entry (so some middle school students may even be able to apply). Homeschooled students are also welcome apply.
- There is no required "theme," but check out the Gallery website so that your card creation falls under one of the card lines featured.
- The Gallery website states that while Christmas cards are their biggest sellers, birthday and anniversary cards are also popular. Have a penchant for sympathy or "get well" messages? Those themes are also welcome. Be sure to browse the Gallery website for ideas, but also remember that their cards are targeted to a corporate clientele.
- The main criteria looked at:
- 1.Overall aesthetic appeal
- 2. Quality of execution
- 3. Creativity and Originality
- 4. Successful incorporation of design elements
- 5. Appropriateness for use as a greeting card

- The winner's award is paid directly to the school they will/are attending.




