


Faculty and Staff




Membership Motivation

- Plan events such as: selling Crumbl and Urban Air Spirit Night




Citizenship Development

- Plan events such as: SGA elections, SCPA Take PSL


Health and Safety

- Plan events such as: Blood Drives, Feminine Product Drive




Environmental Concerns
