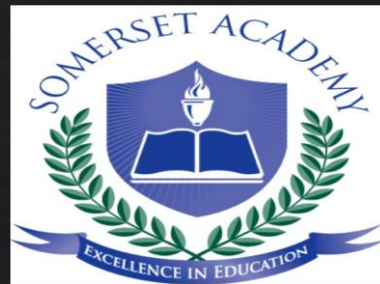

Playing “keep away” = a detention

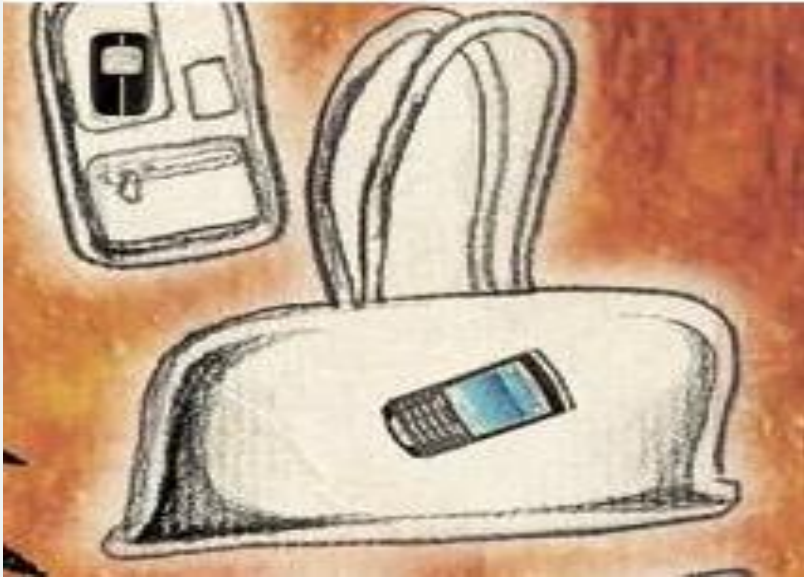
Yoga pants/ leggings/ are not allowed. Not even during dress down days. Dress code violations earn detentions

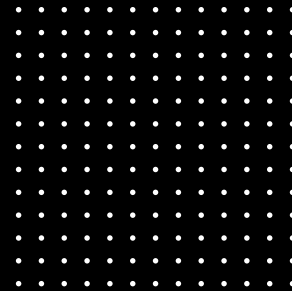


Technology policies

1st Violation – Detention

 - d. School Athletic apparel for game days.

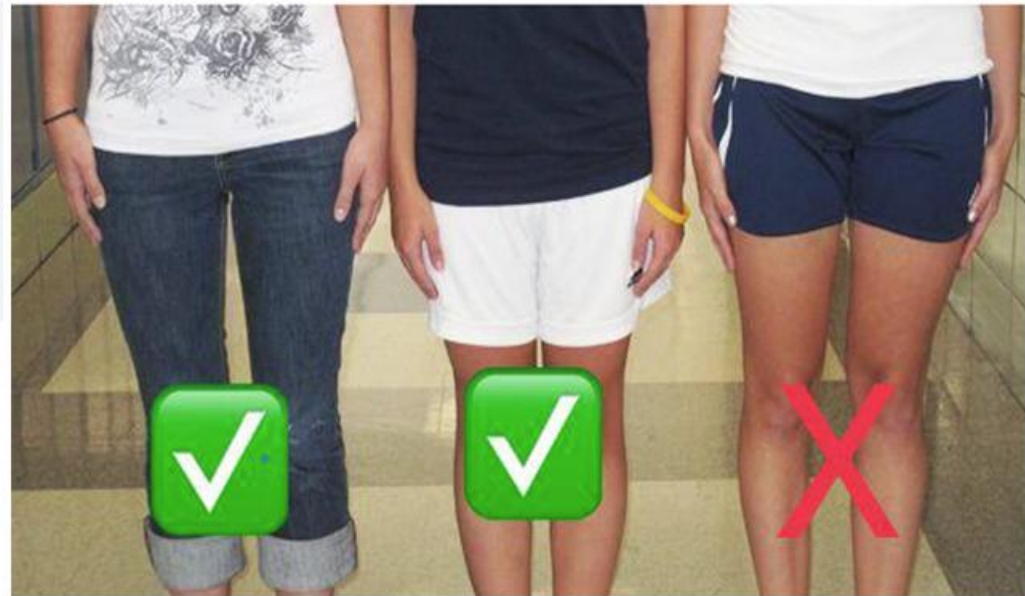

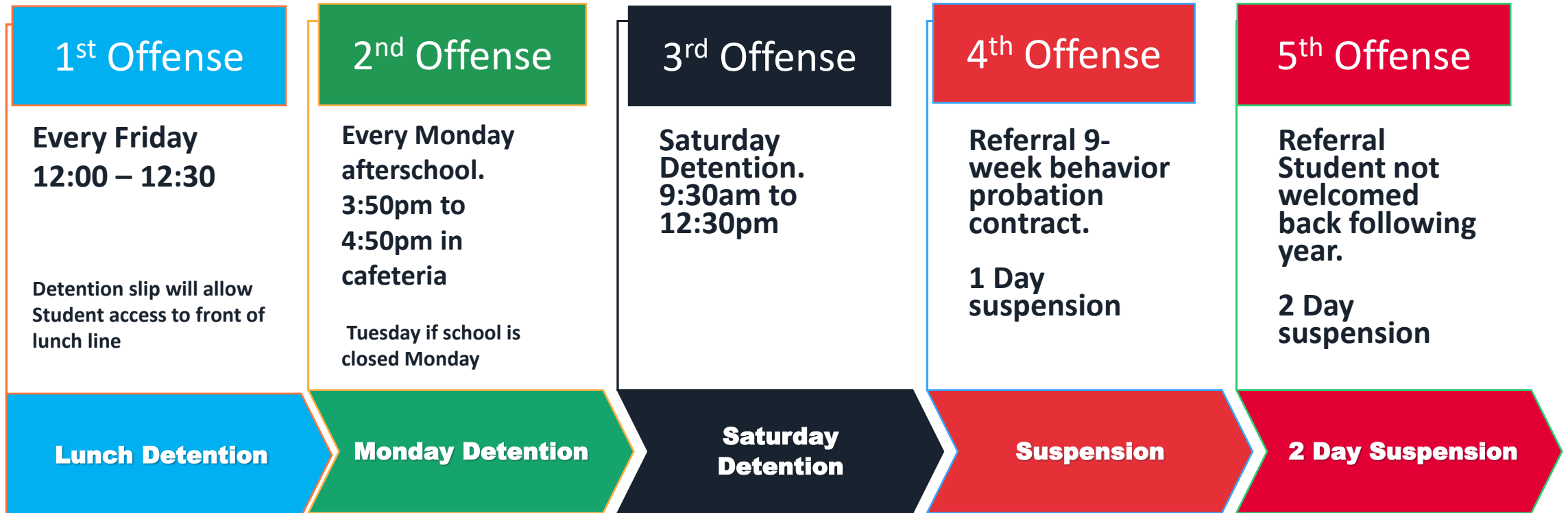
What are FRAYS?

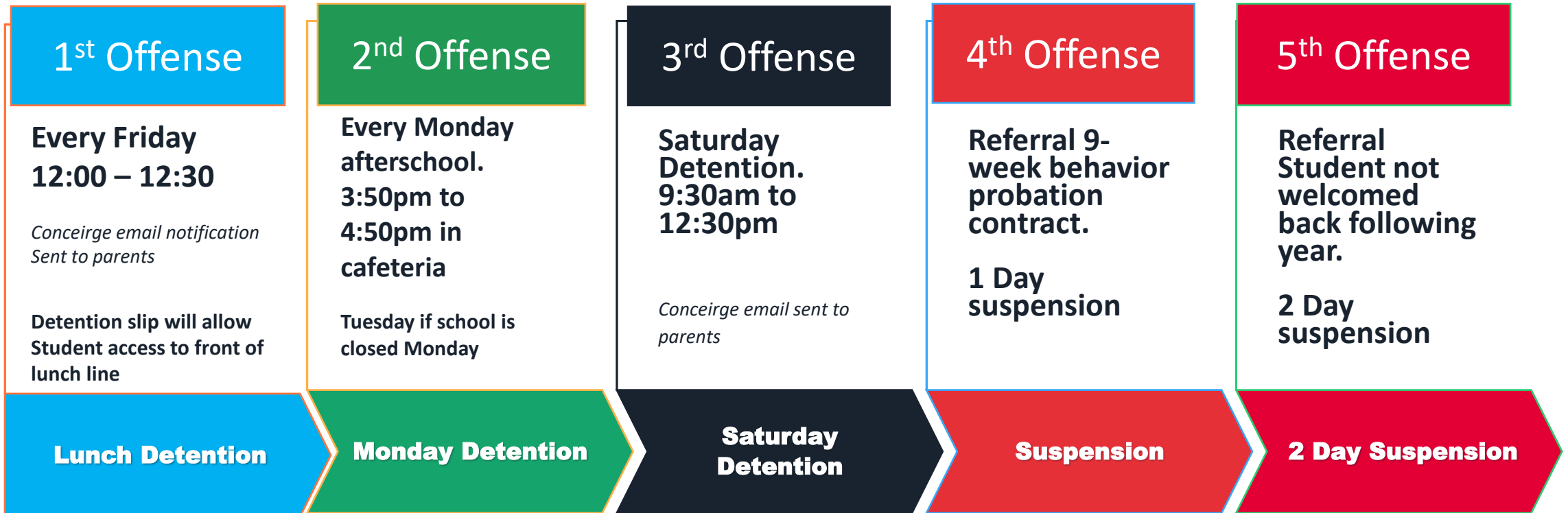


Attention Students

Skipping in the Lunch Line

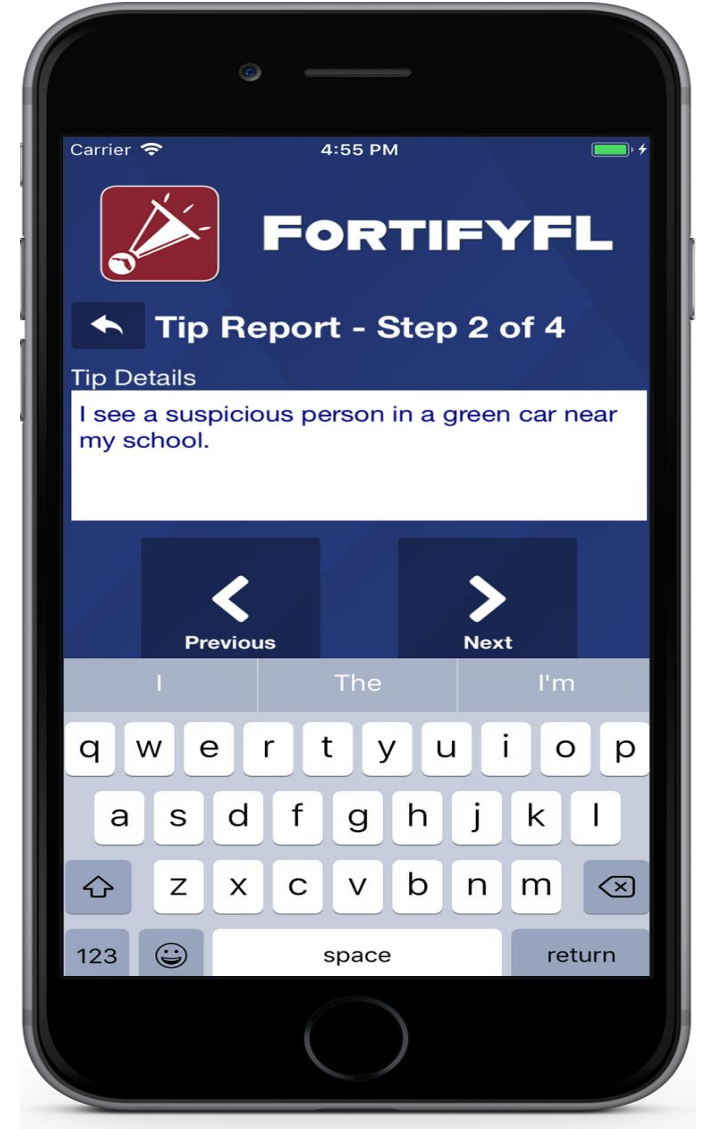

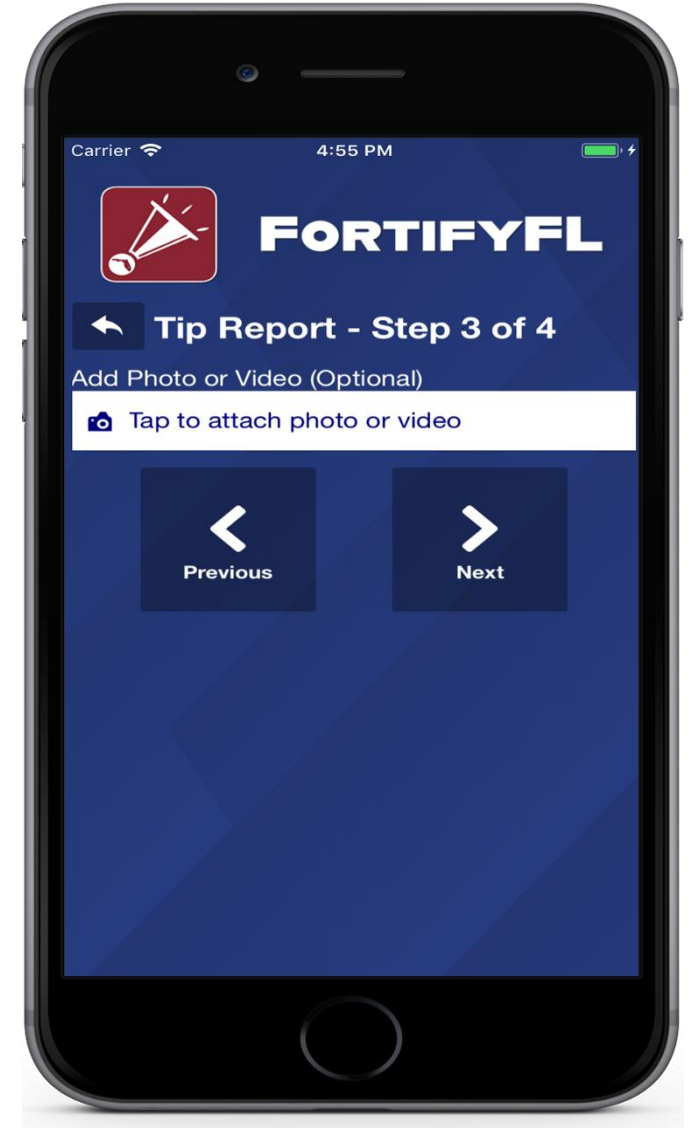
