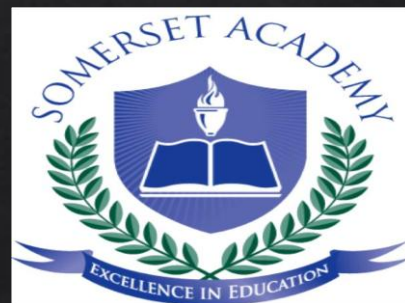

Hang out by the wavy wall side or behind the basketball court bleachers

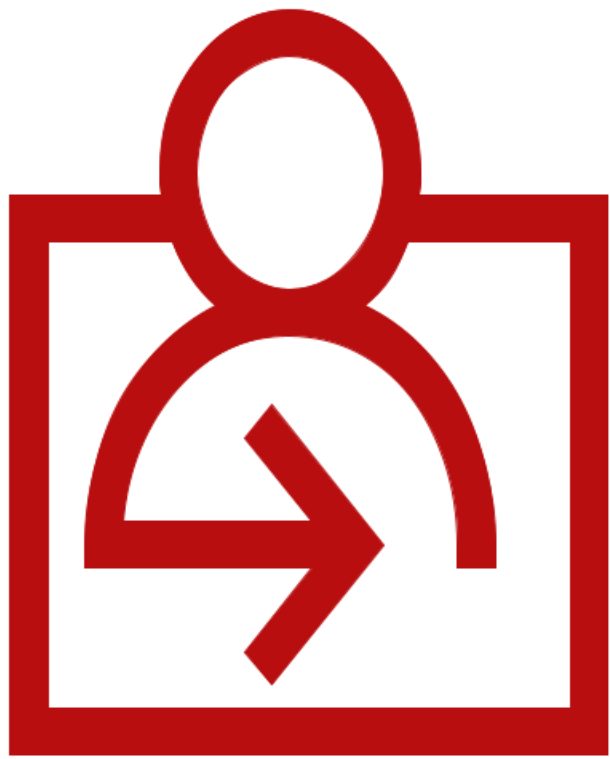
Hang on or grab the basketball nets/rims
