(Similar to Kahoot except you will have more time per question & you'll have a team to work with)



House Chess Competition


- The March 14th will host a House Chess Competition






FFEA Presents Pi-Day Celebration

Beginning Monday, March 4th, there will be 7 buckets that represent each grade in the spill-out.




